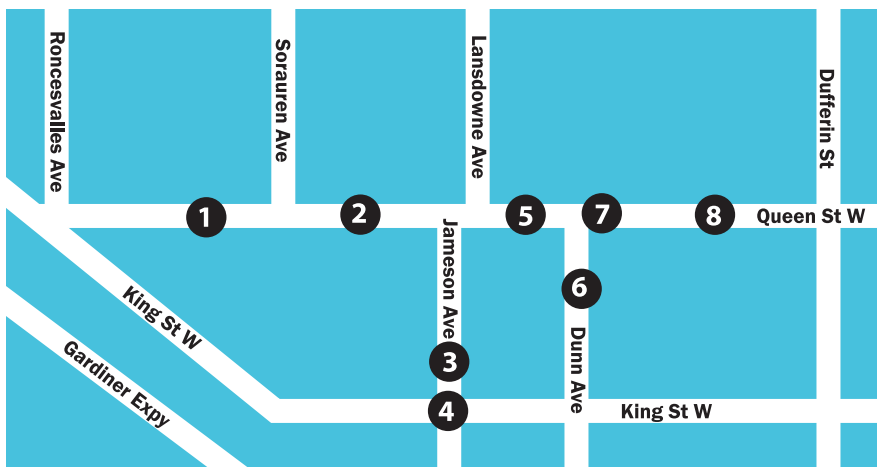


Parkdale Village Neighbourhood Murals 2017

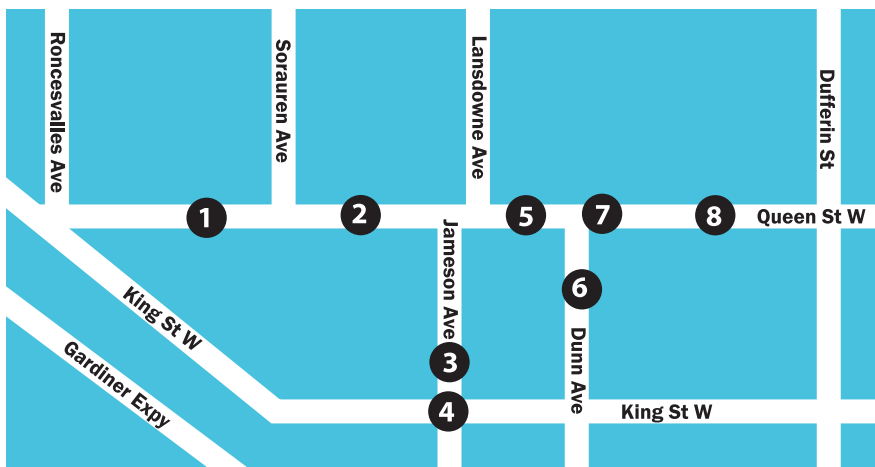
